

Dear Patron,
Greetings from Oswal Auctions.

I feel extremely delighted to present our Auction No. 68 which has a fine selection of coins cherry-picked for your private collection. In this auction, we present one of the finest collections of British India Gold coins ranging from William IV's 1835 Double Mohur to George V's 1918 Sovereign; this collection of 40 coins contain a complete set of dated Mohurs, 5 Rupees & 10 Rupees issued in the intervening period. Additionally, we also have such rarities which have rarely appeared in any Auctions worldwide like the East India Company Madras Presidency 2 Dub; the 1857 Silver Rupee struck at Bareilly, the numismatic testimony to the First War of Independence. Other notable coins including gold Gadyanaka issued by the Chalukyas of Vengi, a pedigree Silver Tanka of the Gujarat Sultan Bahadur Shah, a Gold Mohur of Tipu Sultan, a 1/3 Gold Mohur a.k.a. Panchia of the Malabar Coast issued from the Bombay Presidency, Tipu Sultan's Double Rupees and then some more.

I also feel it is my duty to discuss and make you aware of the implications of the upcoming GST regime. Among its positive implications, we are witnessing a first ever definition of Numismatics by the Government of India under chapter 9705 which is a very welcome step since it is the first time since the Independence. However, at the same time, the steep 12% Tax slab proposed by the GST council has raised concerns among all numismatists whether collector or dealer. The higher tax slab will badly affect our rich numismatic heritage. It is the duty of all of us to save and preserve our Numismatic heritage. Hence, we have collaborated with all Numismatic Auction houses in collectively representing our concerns about the possible implications on the trade to the tax authorities. We hope to achieve success in our efforts soon but also welcome your suggestions and inputs for the GST standoff.

I hope you welcome and patronise this auction as wholeheartedly as our earlier auctions and appreciate the hard work put in to bringing such rare coins for you. We would also like to get your feedback and suggestions for improving our services for the future.



Bahadur Shah was the last of the great king of Gujarat. He was a man of action, His reign was full of Military turmoil. Gujarat was under pressure from the expanding Mughal Empire under emperors Babur and Humayun, and also from the Portuguese, who were establishing fortified settlements on the Gujarat coast. At one time Bahadur Shah held sway, however precariously, over a large area and had his name read in the Khutba in many places not only in Gujarat & Malwa but elsewhere. Bahadur was not only Great Military Leader but He was a great patron of the Hindustani Classical music and its artists, including famous Baiju Bawra.

A unique feature of Gujarat coinage up to & including the reign of Bahadur is the Pedigree Tanka's. The legend on this coin contains the name of the ruler forbears back to the beginning of the dynasty. All these coins are extremely rare & were probably struck as accession commemoratives.

Nadir Shah invaded India in February 1739 under the pretext that the Mughal emperor Muhammad Shah did not check Afghan rebels that were giving trouble to the Iranian kingdom. The Mughal army was defeated at the Battle of Karnal on 13 February 1739 and the Iranians continued their march to capture Delhi on 20 March 1739. In a couple of days, skirmishes between the Iranian army and local soldiery led to a horrible massacre of the inhabitants of Delhi and the city was heavily plundered. To please Nadir Shah, the Mughal emperor declared him the king, read the Khutba in his name and coins were struck in his name too. Nadir finally returned to Iran in May 1739 with his loot – which was so enormous that he forfeited tax collections in Iran for the next three years! The terror struck by Nadir Shah was of such magnitude that coins were issued in his name in mints far away from the capital Delhi – such as Ahmedabad, Banaras and Murshidabad. This coin of Ahmedabad mint is a testimony to this famous historical episode.

The area around Pune began to be monetized under the second Peshwa, Baji Rao I (1720-1740), who undertook many urbanisation projects in Pune city. Eminent money-lending families such as the Bhides, the Datars, the Thattes and the Deos of Chinchwad became active at this time. As numismatic evidence suggests, mints started operating in Pune, Chinchwad and Talegaon around this time. The Chinchwad and Talegaon issues used the rupee of Surat as a prototype, with only the mint-name appropriately changed. The coins remain unpublished and this is the first instance where a rupee is being offered for sale at an auction. The mint-name on the coin is clearly evident.

The town of Talegaon belonged in Jagir to the Dabhade family, who were given the rights to collect tribute in Gujarat by Chhatrapati Shahu. This brought the family in direct conflict with the Peshwa. Their rivalry culminated in the battle of Dabhoi (Gujarat) in April 1731 where Trimbakrao Dabhade was defeated and killed. His mother, Umabai Dabhade continued to struggle against the Peshwa's hegemony. Trimbakrao's son Yashwantrao was a worthless successor and their interests in Gujarat were gradually taken over by their lieutenant Damaji Gaikwad. In 1752, Damaji disowned his allegiance to the Dabhades and came over to the Peshwa's side.

Numismatic Testimony to the First War of Independence-1857



Bareilly, Silver Rupee, 11.07g, struck by Nawab Khan Bahadur Khan during the Revolt at Bareilly, in the name of Shah Alam II, AH 1274/RY 73 (Plate specimen of KM#48). Extremely fine, great historical important coin of supreme rarity.

Bareilly erupted in revolt on 31st May 1857, when Indian soldiers mutinied under the command of Bakht Khan and Muhammad Shafi. They choose 80 year old Khan Bahadur Khan, the grandson of the Rohilla chieftain Hafiz Rahmat Khan, as their leader. Khan Bahadur Khan declared his allegiance to the Mughal Emperor at Delhi and assumed the role of the Subahdar and Nawab of Bareilly. He set up a sound civil and military administration, which survived until the British troops quenched the rebellion in March 1858, forcing Khan Bahadur Khan to flee to Nepal. He was captured in December 1759, brought to trial at Bareilly. He was hanged at Bareilly on 24 March 1860.

As part of his civil administration, Khan Bahadur Khan had set up a 'revenue department'. He decided to strike new coins by setting up a mint, to convert the precious metals he had obtained by way of tribute and plunder into money. The coins were struck by two Goldsmiths namely Ramprasad and Durga Sunar. The coins had legends of Shah Alam II but a curious regnal year '73', which was actually counted from the year in which the Rohillas, under Ghulam Qadir, had controlled Delhi for the last time. The font of legitimacy for Khan Bahadur Khan was thus the reassertion of Rohilla supremacy.

An estimated 5000/6000 rupees were said to have been struck at Bareilly in this short period. The coins remain exceedingly rare with only a few pieces extant in private hands. This coin offers a great opportunity to possess an historical object directly related to a seminal event of great magnitude, which came to bear on the entire course Indian History in the century that followed it.

Present coin is a numismatic testimony to the First War of Independence-1857.

The scarcity of Copper coins in Presidency was mainly due to the total stoppage of Copper imports formerly made by the Dutch, a large portion of which had been converted into Dubs at the Dutch, French & E.I.C. Mint.

- 14. The auctioneer acts solely as an agent and shall not be responsible for any default by either the buyer or the seller or for any action or claim which may arise in respect of any lot.

- 16.
