

Coins of Maharathis of the 'Hathi' family were discovered for the first time in Veerapuram excavations. Alongside Mahahathi, other individuals such as Khadahari Hathi, Sivakhada Hathi and Pahalamasi were known from their coins. They are all very rare. The Hathi Maharathis, pertinently for their name, struck coins in the elephant type.

one such instance. Sivakuhana appears to be an independent Maharathi in North/Central Karnataka at the very end of Satavahana Empire.

Yadavas of Devgiri, Ramchandra Deva, **Light weight** Gold **Gadyana**, 2.77g, Uniface, Five punches-2x stylised Kannada "**Shrī**", 1x Shanka Chakra emblem, 1x Devnagari legend "**Shrī Rama**" around, warrior running to right in centre. *Very fine, rare.*

These types of coins are very different from other issues of Yadavas and was perhaps struck at a diffident provincial mint. The Vaishnavite context of most symbols makes it clear that the coin is an issue of Yadavas.

These coin series merge into the issues of the Arakan Rajas and may therefore have been struck at a more southerly mint, eg. Ramu. Mitchiner attributes the smaller flan coin to Chittagong and the larger flan to Ramu.

Sold ₹ Estimate: ₹ 35,000-40,000

Shams al din Muzaffar Shah III - Second Reign, Silver Rupee, 10.69g, Dar al Darb Ahmedabad Mint, AH 992, Obv: "sultan muzaffar shah ibn Mahmud shah" within double square with dots in between, marginal legend probably, "al sultan al a'zam khallada allah mulkahu wa sultanahu" and mint name, Rev: Shahada within double square with dots in between four caliphs in the margin (G&G# G647). Very fine, extremely rare.

In 1583/AH 991 Muzaffar Shah III regain the throne of Gujarat for very short span. He strucked coins in Mughal pattern in his second reign. Coins dated 991 are rare but coins dated 992 are extremely rare. Muzaffar shah was later captured by Mughal army, he made suicide near Dhamdka-Kutch.

Usual Shroff marks and weak striking on reverse otherwise very fine+ for type, very rare.

The Mughal Emperor Humayun conquered Bihar/ Bengal from Afghan rulers in AH 945 & during his stay in Bengal for short period of nine months he issued Silver coins.
