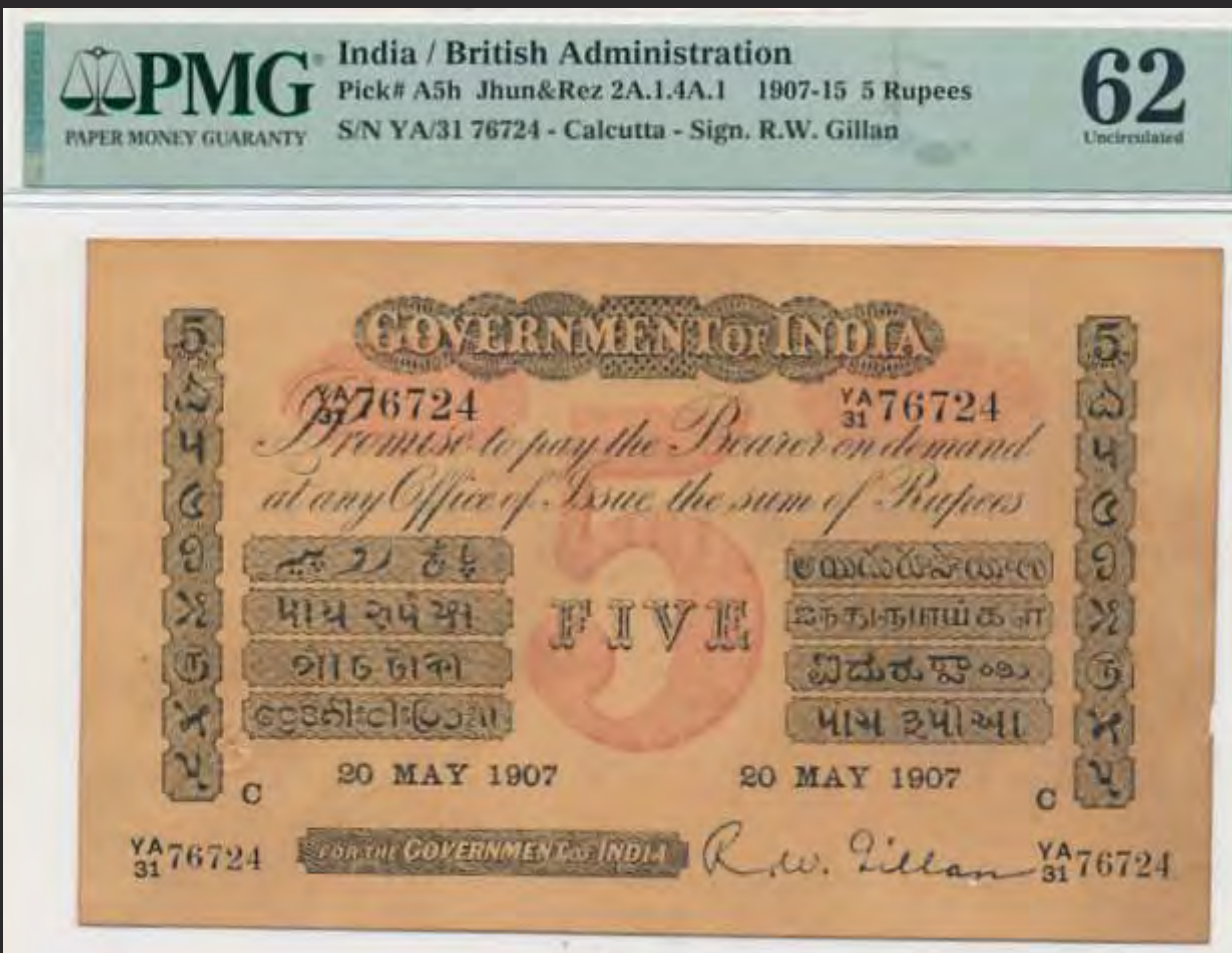

Taj Mahal Sahiba was the Queen of Nawab Nasiruddin Haidar of Awadh, crowned as his chief queen at his coronation in 1828 while only fourteen years old. She was famous for her exquisite beauty and the king was madly in love with her. In 1829, she became the recipient of 6000 Rs/ Month out of the interest the East India Company paid to the king on a loan of 62.5 lac rupees that he extended to the British. This gave a very comfortable income and with it followed a life of luxury and decadence even after the death of Nasiruddin Haidar. In 1849 Taj Mahal was put under a house arrest by the orders of Wajid Ali Shah, for having an affair with Kalbe Hussain, the son of the law minister of the state. Taj Mahal requested Wajid Ali permission to visit Shia holy sites in Iraq and soon after her departure Kalbe Hussain also fled to Iraq. The two were married at Najaf and lived happily till her death in 1881, visiting courts of Iran and Turkey. Taj Mahal left a large portfolio of properties back in Lucknow and it is possible that this badge comes from an employee of her household even while she lived abroad.

The horse-rider therefore becomes a major feature on Rashtrakuta Gold and Silver coins.

The legend on the coin incorporates puns in its choice of words. Its literal meaning would be "The banner of Garuda which has been invincible is the tallest in the World". However, "Jagatunga" or 'Tallest (by fame/valour) in the World' was also a title held by Rashtrakuta ruler Govinda III. He was an illustrious king, credited with many victories, including those against the Pratiharas of Kannauj, the Palas of Bengal, the Eastern Chalukyas of Vengi and the Pallavas of Kanchi. The title 'Apratihata' or 'invincible' applied to him in the coin legend is therefore a fitting acknowledgement of his triumphs. The reign of Govinda III fits well with the heyday of the trade between India and the Arabian Peninsula in the 9th century. The fact that he chooses to show him as a horse rider also befits the nexus established between the Arabs and the Rashtrakutas through commercial activities. The mention of 'Garuda-Dhwaja' or 'Ensign of the Garuda' in the legend refers to the dynastic emblem of the Rashtrakutas, who were Vaishnavites and employed Garuda the bearer of Vishnu to show their devotion to their patron deity.

The obverse depiction of the king is comparable to a recently known image of a local king from Humcha in Shimoga district, where he is described as master of a ball-game. Most likely the game referred to is polo. This is quite plausibly a numismatic depiction of a polo-playing monarch.

The circumfluent punches struck above the outer periphery of the sanctum which consists of 2x Sri-Sri, 1x'Mandalika' and 1x'Kesari' punches inscribed in Kannada. 4 groups of alternating Boar-Lotus-Boar symbol punches separate each of the legend punches on obverse. *Extremely fine, exceedingly rare.*
- The Kakatiya dynasty succeeded the Nolamba dynasty and ruled for a brief period and their coins were extremely rare. Prola-II was a feudatory to the Chalukya Vikramaditya-VI and proclaimed independence with the decline of the Chalukyas. Prola-II extended his kingdom up to Krishna district. The above coin is from a small hoard that surfaced up ~2.5 years ago and had a mix of Nolamba, Ganga, and Kakatiya coins. The hoard has evaporated since then and it is a royal opportunity to bag this coin.

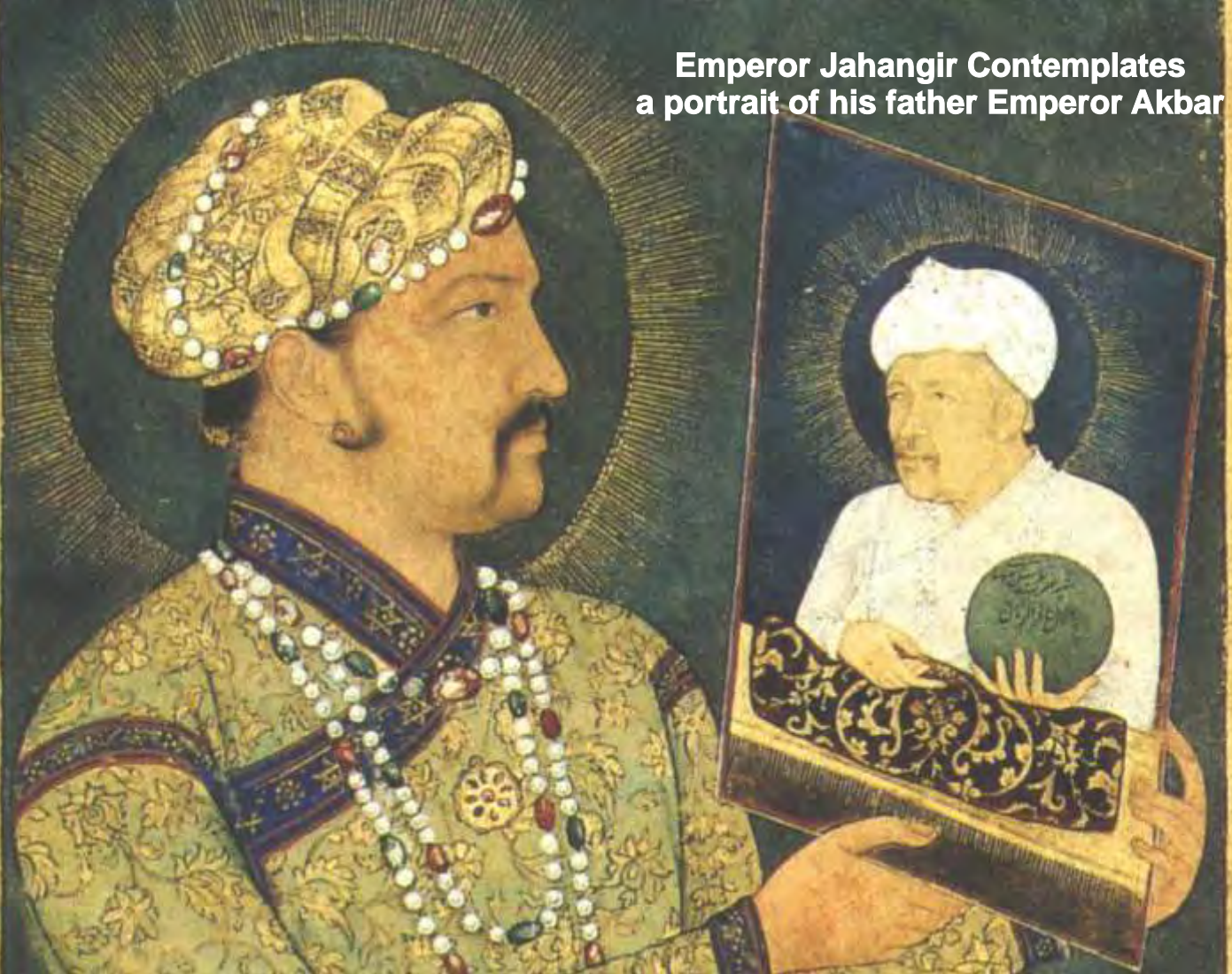

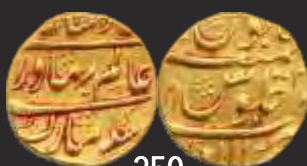

A key player in this was Ahmad Shah Durrani the Afghan ruler who desired to recover his claim on the Mughal subahs of Kashmir, Sindh and the Punjab. His expedition to upper Sindh in 1752 had already sounded alarm bells in Kutch. Probably as a measure to pacify the highly fearful Shah, Lakhpatji resorted to strike coins in his name, thereby nominally acknowledging his sovereignty. It is interesting to note that the dates on these ceremonial coins is AH1169 which is a year in advance of Ahmad Shah's 4th invasion of India in which he occupied Delhi and staged a massacre at Mathura. Perhaps, Lakhpatji was being very cautious about the Shah's intentions, which is a rare instance of political sagaciousness shown by a weak but prosperous ruler, to save his skin in view of an impending crisis.

Sir Bertrand Mackennal, the famed sculptor and engraver was commissioned to design the coins of new Emperor King George V. The crowned and regally decorated bust of the King appeared on the obverse side, while the reverse side had a floral design. Unlike the simple floral pattern of its predecessors, the new reverse side design screamed British Empire. This design featured the three emblems of the United Kingdom: The Rose of England, the Thistle of Scotland, and the Shamrock of Ireland. The Lotus of India appeared on the top. This side featuring the King's bust depicted the "Order of the Indian Empire", which was worn by the British sovereign. The golden collar chain of the Order was decorated with golden elephants, roses and peacocks. But due to poor engraving the coins' "Elephant" looked like a Pig. The Elephant's body and legs were quite disproportionate. No tusks were discernible, and the short trunk resembled a Pig's snout. Thus these coins were called as Pig Rupee. So authority recalled these Pig Rupee for melting.

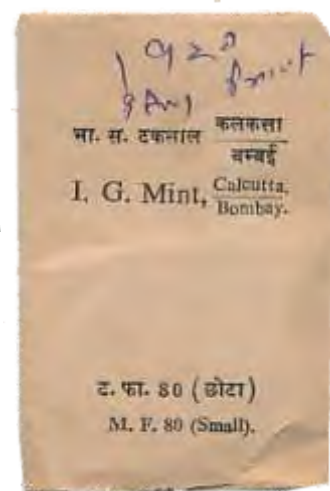
