



Gold Coins. There are some rarely appear Lord Padmanabha- Ananthasayee Vishnu type Venad Cheras coins, a very beautiful and rare Silver Rupee of Sikandar Shah Suri and other Sultanate coins. Exceedingly rare Madura Sultan Gold half Dinar of Ghiyath al-din Muhammad Damghan, Mughal Silver Shahrukhi's of emperor Akbar & half Shahrukhi of Humayun, Copper double Dam- Tanka of Akbar Agra Mint, Jahangir Udaipur Mint, beautiful specimen of Azam Shah Silver Rupee of Ahmedabad Mint, exceedingly rare and probably 2nd piece known Gold Mohur of Shah Alam Qandahar Mint and other rare Mughal coins. 3 Archaic, Punch Marked, Silver Reduced 1/2 Siglos- 1/4 Shatamana standard, 2.25g, Kabul river valley, 'Chaman Huzuri' or 'Shaikhan Dheri' hoard type, usually attributed to Kamboja janapada, scyphate series, Obv: two symbols with abstract geometric patterns struck over each other, topped by a small banker's mark, Rev: a floral symbol struck by a single die (Unlisted in Rajgor). *Very fine for type, extremely rare.*

Coins of the Chaman Huzuri Hoard discovered in 1933, are probably the earliest coins struck in the wider Indian subcontinent. In 2007, a group of similar composition was reportedly found at Shaikhan Dheri near Peshawar. These coins are struck to the Achamaenian standard, mapped on the Indian shatamana standard. The coin here offers a unique opportunity to acquire a highly historic piece for the numismatic connoisseurs.

About extremely fine, very rare in this grade.

Kushan, Huvishka, Copper Tetradrachm, 11.04g, "Elephant rider" type, struck at Main Mint in Kapisha (Begram?), early phase, Obv: Huvishka on elephant facing right, holding trident and anku a (elephant goad); traces of Bactrian legend around, Rev: Huvishka kneeling before goddess Ardoksho standing, holding a cornucopia; tagma to left and traces of Bactrian legend around. (Not listed in Göbl). Very fine, extremely rare.

One of the rarest types of Kushan copper coins, here we see a unique depiction on the reverse: the king kneeling before a deity. On the handful of coins of this type previously offered in auctions, the goddess is Nana holding a lion-head sceptre. However here the goddess clearly holds a cornucopia so should be identified as Ardoksho, the Kushan goddess of plenty and the equivalent of Indian Lakshmi. This is a new and previously unknown feature which makes this coin unique.

Very fine, very rare.

Tribal, Kunindas, Amoghabhuti, Silver Drachma, 2.23g, "Lakshmi" type, Obv: A Deer to right with a female figure standing facing on 34 right, holding flower in uplifted right hand, "Rajnah Kunidasya Amogh [bhutisya]" around Brahmi legend, Rev: Six arched hill, tree in railing, swastika, Nandipada, triangular headed symbol and around Kharoshthi legend (Pieper# 1198). Extremely fine+.

Tribal, Kunindas, Amoghabhuti, Silver Drachma, 2.22g, "Lakshmi" type, Obv: A Deer to right with a female figure standing facing on 35 right, holding flower in uplifted right hand, "Rajnah Kunidasya Amogh [bhutisya]" around Brahmi legend, Rev: Six arched hill, tree in railing, swastika, Nandipada, triangular headed symbol and around Kharoshthi legend (Pieper# 1198). 42 Post Mauryan, Eastern Malwa, City State, Erikachha, Copper, 7.22q, Uniface, Palm tree in a railing and bow-and-arrow with bold Brahmi legend "Erikachha" on obverse. Deep bold strike, extremely fine, rare.

Realised ` Estimate: ` 3,000-4,000



Northern Maharashtra, Uninscribed (?) die-struck coin in Copper Alloyed, 3.65g, Obv: Three arched hill, Nandipada to right and a water tank-like symbol above, Rev: Six arched hill, symbol like Brahmi letter "Na" to right, open cross with Taurines above and the water tank-like symbol at the top. Very fine, very rare.

Some of these coins show traces of Brahmi letters engraved retrograde and there is a likelihood that they might bear the legend 'Nasikam'. If this is confirmed, it will suggest a major discovery of an urban centre in Northern Maharashtra issuing its own coins in the pre-Satavahana period.

Pre-Satavahana, Marathwada, Vidarbha region, Uninscribed die-struck coin, Copper, 2.98g, Obv: Elephant standing facing, Rev: 44 Tree with delicate leaves interspersed with small Nandipada symbols, and flanked by other small symbols like an 'Ujjain' symbol to right. Very fine, extremely rare.

The coin has an unusually detailed and artistic symbolic program. The depiction of a facing elephant is also highly unusual for a Deccan series of uninscribed coins.

Post-Mauryan/ Pre-Satavahana, Western, Khandesh region, Prakashe, Lower Tapi Valley, Uninscribed die- struck, Copper 45 Alloyed, 5.91q, Obv: Bold tree in railing & Taurine below its branch on the left, Rev: Three arched hill placed within an "open cross" symbol. Very fine, very rare.

It is more usual to find coins of this type with a Swastika inside the cross symbol. A variety with three-arched hill instead is a much rarer occurrence.

Pre-Satavahana, Monarchical coinage of Vidrabha region, King Subena, Copper Alloyed, 6.63g, Obv: Man standing with bent 46 knees on a lotus, holding staff and water pot, small Shrivatsa to right, Brahmi legend "Raño Subena..." to left, inscribed vertically, Rev: Bull standing facing right, with a large wheel having arrowed spokes above its back. To right, a cockerel standard (Kukkuta Dhwaja) in railing (Pieper# 2451). Extremely fine, extremely rare.

Subena appears to be an independent local ruler in Eastern Vidarbha and his coins show great similarity with those of Suryamitra and Satyabhadra II, the two local rulers. We know Suryamitra was a close contemporary of Satavahana king Satakani. Subena was perhaps a slightly earlier ruler. His name indicates his association with river Bena, which was a major river in the region (present-day Wainganga).

Very fine, very rare.

The Kakatiya dynasty succeeded the Nolamba dynasty and ruled for a brief period and their coins are extremely rare. Prola-II was a feudatory to the Chalukya Vikramaditya-VI and proclaimed independence with the decline of the Chalukyas. Prola-II extended his kingdom up to Krishna district.



The coin is interesting because presumably there is no evidence of Qandahar being under Mughal control during the reign of Shah Alam Bahadur. The Mughals wrested Qandahar from the Persians for one final time in 1698 when Sarmand Khan of Kalat, owing allegiance to Aurangzeb, established himself there. However, the Safavids regained control over the town by 1704. In 1709, Mirwais Khan Hotak, managed to slay the Safavid governor and the Iranian occupation ended. It is likely that Mirwais Khan nominally paid allegiance to the Mughals to bolster his position against the Safavids. These coins appear to be struck at this fleeting moment. The epithet 'Dar al-Daulat' corresponds to the fact that Mirwais Khan made Qandahar his capital. He went on to found the Hotaki Afghan dynasty which ultimately contributed to the demise of Safavid power.

After his 4th invasion of India, Ahmad Shah Durrani appointed Taimur Shah as the Nizam of the occupied territory of the Punjab, with Adina Beg, the Nawab as his governor. Adina Beg revolted against the Afghans and called the Marathas for help. A large army under the command of Raghunath Rao invaded Punjab in April 1758 and Taimur Shah fled towards Afghanistan. The Marathas occupied Lahore on 20th April 1758 and established their rule over the *Subah* of Punjab. The occupation by the Marathas did not last for more than 6 months. Adina Beg suddenly died in early 1759, which gave a chance to Ahmad Shah Abdali to invade India for the 5th time in late October 1759. The Marathas then retreated out of the Punjab.

Rupees struck by the Marathas in the name of Alamgir II at this time are known with dates AH 1172 and AH 1173, both with (posthumous) regnal year 7. AH 1173 commences on 25.08.1759 and the Marathas fled the Punjab in early November 1759 so presumably the coin was struck in short two Month gap in between.

This is an unusual type of coin of the Nizam where the name of a Hindu deity is used as a mint-mark or a signifier for an issuer / licensee who farmed the minting rights. On 19 January 1886, Indore State issued a circular that the existing copper coins were dissimilar and of different dies. A merchant named Mangat Ram was given the contract to strike copper coinage on behalf of the State. He experimented with using simple machines like a screw press, to ensure uniformity and quick output.

The newly machine struck copper coins were put into circulation by January 1886 (Vs1942). Traders could obtain them at 16 1/2 takkas (33 paisa) and redistribute them at 32 paisa to a rupee. But known 1942-dated coins are of two weights – 12g and 16g – so evidently a paisa and a takka denomination were both produced.

These were the earliest experiments with mechanised coin production at Indore. Their designs are inspired by hand-struck coins already in circulation. The 1942-dated coins are known in two weights – 12g and 16g. In subsequent years a few more designs were tried. Unlike normal practice, these patterns appear to end in circulation probably because of the expense involved in their production.


