

Very fine, very rare. The 'standing human figure' is emblematic of Tripuri coins and is seen on coins of Datta, Mitra, Satavahana and Bodhi rulers. Most of these coins are of lead, suggesting it to be circulatory money serving localized economy of Tripuri urban centre.

To right, a cockerel standard (Kukkuta Dhwaja) in railing (Pieper# 2451). About very fine, extremely rare.

Subena appears to be an independent local ruler in Eastern Vidarbha and his coins show great similarity with those of Suryamitra and Satyabhadra II, the two local rulers. We know Suryamitra was a close contemporary of Satavahana king Satakani. Subena was perhaps a slightly earlier ruler. His name indicates his association with river Bena, which was a major river in the region (present-day Wainganga).

Extremely fine, extremely rare.

Maharathis in Central Maharashtra during the first phase of Satavahana decline, Siva Vijha Satakani, Alloyed Copper, 4.88g, 38 Obv: Three-arched hill with crescent flanked and topped by small taurines, wavy line below; Brahmi legend "...rathisa Siva Vijha Sa(taka)nisa" clockwise from 9 o'clock, Rev: Tree in railing (Not listed in PAIC). Extremely fine, extremely rare. Coins of this Maharathi with a 'Satakani' name ending have been recently discovered. This sheds an important light on the political situation during the period of the first decline of the Satavahanas. It shows that some members of the wider Satavahana family who held subordinate offices, asserted independence during this period.

Brahmi 40 legend "Sri Mahendraditya", below the legend Brahmi letter "Na", No dots, no Kalasha (S Kumar# Class I, variety G). Cutted for metal testing otherwise about extremely fine, extremely rare.

Maitrakas of Vallabhi, Bhattaraka, Silver Drachma (10), Obv: Bust of king right, Rev: Trident with straight prongs and Brahmi legend "Rajno Mahakshatrapa- (pa) ramaditya-bhakta MahaSamanta sri Sarvva Bhattarakasa" (ACW# 4886). Very fine to very fine+. 10 coins. Realised ` Estimate: ` 4,000-5,000



Post Gupta Sindh, Hunnic issues, Shri Jagaprakasha, Debased Gold Dinar, 6.98g, Obv: Sasanian-style bust, wearing horned 43 crown and diadem ribbons, facing right, Brahmi legend "Shri Jaga Pra(kasha)" to right, Rev: Fire altar in centre, topped by a Linga emanating fire with attendants on either side (Not listed in major publications). Very fine, exceedingly rare.

It is not known who exactly 'Jagaprakasha' was but he is evidently a Huna ruler with a Prakasha-ending name. The Hunas made forays down the Indus in the reign of Mihirakula so it is probable Jagaprakasha was a viceroy appointed by him in the region.

The legend on the coin incorporates puns in its choice of words. Its literal meaning would be "The banner of Garuda which has been invincible is the tallest in the World'. However, "Jagatunga" or 'Tallest (by fame/valour) in the World' was also a title held by Rashtrakuta ruler Govinda III. He was an illustrious king, credited with many victories, including those against the Pratiharas of Kannauj, the Palas of Bengal, the Eastern Chalukyas of Vengi and the Pallavas of Kanchi. The title 'Apratihata' or 'invincible' applied to him in the coin legend is therefore a fitting acknowledgement of his triumphs. The reign of Govinda III fits well with the heyday of the trade between India and the Arabian Peninsula in the 9th century. The fact that he chooses to show him as a horse rider also befits the nexus established between the Arabs and the Rashtrakutas through commercial activities. The mention of 'Garuda-Dhwaja' or 'Ensign of the Garuda' in the legend refers to the dynastic emblem of the Rashtrakutas, who were Vaishnavites and employed Garuda the bearer of Vishnu to show their devotion to their patron deity. The obverse depiction of the king is comparable to ac recently known image of a local king from Humcha in Shimoga district, where he is described as master of a ball-game. Most likely the game referred to is polo. This is quite plausibly a numismatic depiction of a polo-playing monarch.

Ahmad Shah occupied Delhi for the fifth time soon after October 1760, when the Marathas, beleaquered by lack of money, left the city to proceed northwards. He held a Darbar at this occasion and formally acknowledged Shah Alam II as the absentee emperor, investing Najib Khan Rohilla with the office of his deputy, paymaster and plenipotentiary. Nazarana rupees and mithgals, struck for the purpose of Nisar toward off the evil eye, were struck at this time.

Only one other mithqal Nisar is known and it is from the Whitehead collection in the British Museum. This piece is perhaps the only known specimen in private hands. Both are ex-mount – as a special return gift from the emperor these must have been considered to have magical powers and therefore worn on the bodies of the recipients.

Soon afterwards in November, Ahmad Shah left Delhi leaving a garrison in charge, to follow the Marathas. The two met at the fateful battle of Panipat in January 1761. The Marathas were defeated and Ahmad Shah made a triumphant return to Delhi. He stayed till March, holding another grand Darbar. Nazarana coins were struck again but they bear the RY 15. No Nisars are yet known.

The Imperial mint at Madras was closed in 1869 and the machinery sold to the state of Hyderabad. The first attempt to utilize that equipment for coin production did not occur until 1884. The Nizam of Hyderabad, Mahbub Ali Khan, succeeded Afzal ad-Daula at the age of three in 1869, but was only invested with full State control by the British Viceroy Lord Ripon in February 1884. Lingen proposed that this rupee pattern, dated AH1301 (2 Nov. 1883 - 20 Oct. 1884), was intended as a nazarana rupee, arguing the "the omission of the regnal year shows that it must have been used as a presentation piece on the occasion of the investiture celebrations of the Nizam." He also notes that it is "very likely that this issue was struck locally on the old machinery acquired from the Madras Mint." Lingen recorded only an example as a pattern in silver that had appeared in a Noble Numismatics Sale 53 in April 1997, but was unaware of the copper pattern. 
