



The letters '*NA*' below the horse are interesting, because we know of a local Iranian king named 'Naxshen' who struck coins in the same type but with his own name.



Sarhind was firmly under the control of the Durrani before its Afghan Governor Abd us-Samad Khan was killed by the Marathas when they captured Kunjpura on 13 October 1760. Sarhind was not occupied by the Marathas but it had already been an established mint in the region and coins were struck there by the Durrani before and after the battle of Panipat on 14 January 1761. This coin bears the name of Shah Alam II, who was proclaimed as the Emperor at Delhi in October 1760 by the Marathas. Considering the sequence of political events and numismatic data, it is clear that this coin fits between October 1760 and January 1761. No one apart from the Marathas had been partisan of Shah Alam II during this period. But if Sarhind was not under direct occupation of the Marathas, then the question follows: where was this coin struck? We know that the Marathas were starved of cash and their attack on Kunjpura yielded plenty of treasure. It is therefore plausible that they struck coins with the mint-name 'Sarhind' because they were the most current coins in the region, and possibly preferred by the Sikhs in payments for all the military aid they had been providing the Marathas with. We also know that in their exasperation, the Marathas produced some coins at while being besieged at Panipat. They could well have struck these coins at Panipat. Whichever way one looks at it, there is no doubt that the coin belongs to an interesting and important phase of history. It is also very rare – so far the only other known piece of this sort is known to exist in the British Museum.
